Even though we have not officially opened the doors to our museum, our Board Members and Volunteers have already contributed to the Central Illinois community.


#### A few highlights:

### Fundraising

Project XV Museum received a second grant for four thousand dollars from Landmarks Illinois's Preservation Heritage Fund. These monies enable us to compensate the folks completing the necessary building repairs to ensure our historic space remains intact and safe for occupants.

Our Giving Tuesday 2024 Campaign saw the investment of more than one thousand dollars into our efforts for rural civics education. Board Members united to drive this campaign via email and social media posts, and we are all proud with the successes we have had. For 2025, we plan to continue developing our outreach methods and improving metric tracking for better analysis.

For 2025, our Board will continue to pursue grant funding to secure the opening of our doors, develop our exhibits, and invite fresh research into our displays. While it varies between individual grants, an estimated 10%-30% of grant applications are

successful. As such, we continue to pursue other revenue streams beyond relying solely upon grant monies to preserve rural history and further rural civics education.

#### Elevator



We remain beyond grateful for all of our donors, as it is the spirit of generosity and value of rural civics education that brings us all together. A sincere thank you to all!












#### Gifts, Grants, Contributions, and Membership Fees Received
